I am fortunate enough to have health insurance; however, these costs are clearly exorbitant. The tax write-off for this facility must be enormous. We ALL pay for these charges-whether in higher co-pays, higher premiums, or both. Charges of over \$20,000.00 for an ER visit of less than 2 hours, < than 5 minutes with a physician, and procedures that did not entail extraordinary scans and/or medications is patently price gouging/fixing.
