Some of the ways we measure and demonstrate our commitment to the individuals and communities we serve include:

Benefit to the underprivileged	\$10,329,363
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Through the cost of providing charity care and by supplementing the shortfall between what we receive in Medicaid reimbursements and the cost of providing such care (charity care does not include bad debt).

Benefit to the elderly	\$1,021,298
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As provided through the governmental Medicare funding, by subsidizing the unreimbursed costs associated with this care.

Benefit to the community's overall health and wellness	\$50,656
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Through the cost of providing health education and screenings along with donations to support local organizations in improving the quality of life for our community members.

Benefit to the community by investing in capital improvement	\$28,800,413
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To ensure that the facility and its technology provide the best possible care to the community.
